

Chronic/Subchronic Toxicity: <a href="Imidacloprid Technical">Imidacloprid Technical</a>: 2-year feeding study in rats resulted in an NOEL of

100 ppm; 1-year feeding study in dogs resulted in an NOEL of 1,250 ppm. <u>Imidacloprid Technical:</u> In a battery of 23 laboratory mutagenicity assays, imidacloprid tested negative for mutagenic effects in all but two of the assays. It did test positive for causing changes in chromosomes in human

lymphocytes, as well as testing positive for genotoxicity in Chinese hamster ovary cells. Taken collectively, the data demonstrate that imidacloprid is not

mutagenic.

**Reproductive Toxicity:** <u>Imidacloprid Technical:</u> NOEL 100 ppm (8 mg/kg/day)(rat)

Target Organs: <u>Imidacloprid Technical:</u> Thyroid lesions at very high doses in rats.
